MINOR IN JOURNALISM

Advising Sheet for 2023-2024

The journalism minor seeks to help students learn to practice the value of journalism, develop a critical media literacy, become enmeshed in current events and their social and political contexts, critically evaluate sources of information, be able to write clearly and effectively in multiple genres using multiple technologies, and develop a broad skillset that will enable them to navigate the field of journalism in a changing media landscape.
