Special Library Exhibition Global Religious Diversity

The F.H. Green Library will offer an exhibit with the theme of Global Religious Diversity in support of WCU IFest 2015. This topic was chosen to coincide with both Pope Francis's visit to the United States and the World Meeting of Families in Philadelphia. World Meeting attendees hail from 150 nations and represent a range of generations, socio-economic backgrounds, and faith traditions.

The library's display will feature rarely-seen items from Special Collections including George Morris Philips's personal Bible, which he used to perform convocations at West Chester Normal School beginning in the 1890s. Additional items from the circulating collection will highlight an array of diverse faiths from around the globe.

The exhibit will be located on the 2nd floor of the F.H. Green Library near the main entrance and viewable during library hours of operation
