## **Community Immersive Semester for Educators**

Part of the Urban Teacher Track

**Students in the CISE program** spend three full days per week in a K-8 urban public school in West Philadelphia and have up to five of their WCU courses taught on-site. Typically, students take part in CISE during the fall of their sophomore year.

## You are eligible if you are:

- Willing to be available during the Fall 2022 semester on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, 8:00AM to 5:00PM\* (\*some evening & weekend time also required)
- Willing to travel from your campus or home location to West Philadelphia (travel stipends may be available)
- An EGP or EGP/EDA major (potential options for interested MGP majors in Fall 2022 see Dr. Solic)
- Able to take all (or nearly all) of the following courses: EDR 304, EDR 307, EDF 255, EGP 326, EGP 220.



## Students in CISE learn:

- to understand the context in which children are growing and learning.
- to center the wisdom of historically marginalized communities as a source of knowledge for teaching.
- to challenge deficit perspectives that are sometimes held about students, families, and schools in neighborhoods that are underresourced and serve students who have been historically marginalized by race, socioeconomic status, or language.
